### 2018 Annual Symposium: Language Sciences and Health

This year's Annual Symposium on 13 November was a great opportunity for interdisciplinary networking and collaboration, with over 150 colleagues in attendance from across the Schools of Arts & Humanities, Humanities & Social Sciences, Technology, Clinical Medicine and Biological Sciences. Delegates also included representatives from Cambridge Assessment, Cambridge University Press as well as Speech and Language Therapy clinicians from Cambridge Biomedical Campus.

The event highlighted the importance of language for individual wellbeing and developmental trajectories, and the significant potential of Natural Language Processing to contribute to research on public health. The speakers were Prof. Usha Goswami (Centre for Neuroscience in Education), Prof. Courtenay Norbury (University College London), Dr Jenny Gibson (Faculty of Education), Dr Claudia Abreu Lopes (Africa's Voices Foundation) and Dr Maria Liakata (University of Warwick/Alan Turing Institute).

### Language, Brains & Machines: meeting #2

The *Language, Brains & Machines* interdisciplinary research workshop, jointly organised with [Cambridge Neuroscience](#), took place on 15 October at the MRC Cognition and Brain Sciences Unit. There were over 50 participants from a range of research backgrounds. Presenters from Computer Science & Technology, Psychology, Cognition & Brain Sciences and Theoretical & Applied Linguistics provided an overview of their work relating to computational neurolinguistics. This was followed by opportunities for delegates to discuss data-sharing and future collaborative research in this emerging field.
